His love of glassblowing afforded him the opportunity to work and study in 43 states and on three continents, from a glass studio set on a barge in the Amsterdam canals to the San Juan Islands in the Pacific Northwest. He has studied in quiet mountains in South Africa, and performed on the rocking plains of Tennessee for the Bonnaroo music festival. His partnership with David Sandidge over the past decade has led to the culmination of his International Hot Glass gallery and studio, housed in the Artegon Marketplace.
