



Crealdé Fellowship Program Application



Crealdé Fellows are the heart of the on-campus curriculum and provide an example and inspiration to students of all ages and levels who participate in Crealdé programs. Applicants must be nominated by a Faculty member in the specific department and applications approved by the Department Director. Once approved, fellowship students are cleared for an initial two-year term which may be extended for a total of five consecutive years. During the fellowship period, participants can enroll in one class per session at no cost and have unlimited studio use. Prior to utilizing these privileges, fellows must log a minimum of 32 volunteer hours per session, pay their \$50 fellowship dues and be a current member.

Procedure - Applicants are accepted on an on-going basis and should be given to Studio and Program Managers.

- The applicant must be a Crealdé member.
- The applicant must be at least 18 years of age at the time of the application.
- The applicant must submit:
 - Resume or list of Crealdé classes attended
 - Letter of artistic intent
 - Signed agreement from the Fellowship Guidelines
